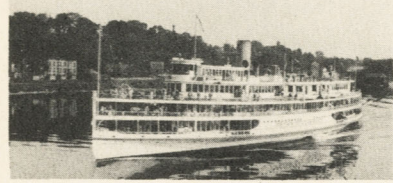

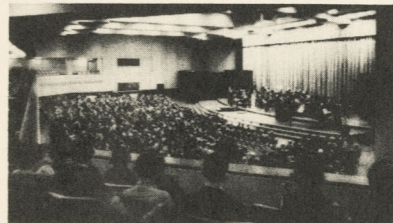

WEDNESDAYS

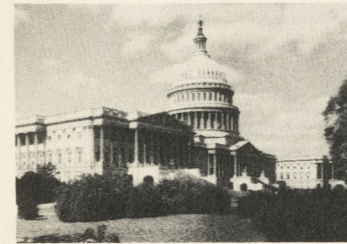

THURSDAYS

The morning is free for shopping or what you will. Your motorcoach will call for you at 12:45 p.m. (D.S.T.) to take you and your baggage to the Pennsylvania Station, where your train for Washington leaves at 1:30 p.m. (D.S.T.) A—Side-trip down SKYLINE DRIVE to CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA.

B—WASHINGTON, D.C. Stopover en route to New York

This optional feature permits you to leave home on Saturday—a day in advance of the tour party—on THE GEORGE WASHINGTON, arriving in the Nation's Capital the following morning. It includes dinner where necessary and breakfast on the train, which are included in the main features of the tour, and motor transfer in Washington from the station to the Hotel Lee-Sheraton; luncheon, dinner, and lodgings at the hotel on Sunday, as well as a delightful afternoon sightseeing motorcoach tour to Arlington National Cemetery, Alexandria, and Mt. Vernon ... breakfast at the hotel on Monday and motor transfer to the station, where you will join the party on the 9:00 a.m. train for New York. The cost of this stopover is \$7.50 per person, based on sharing a double-bedded room with bath. Rates for twin-bedded and single rooms will be made upon application.
