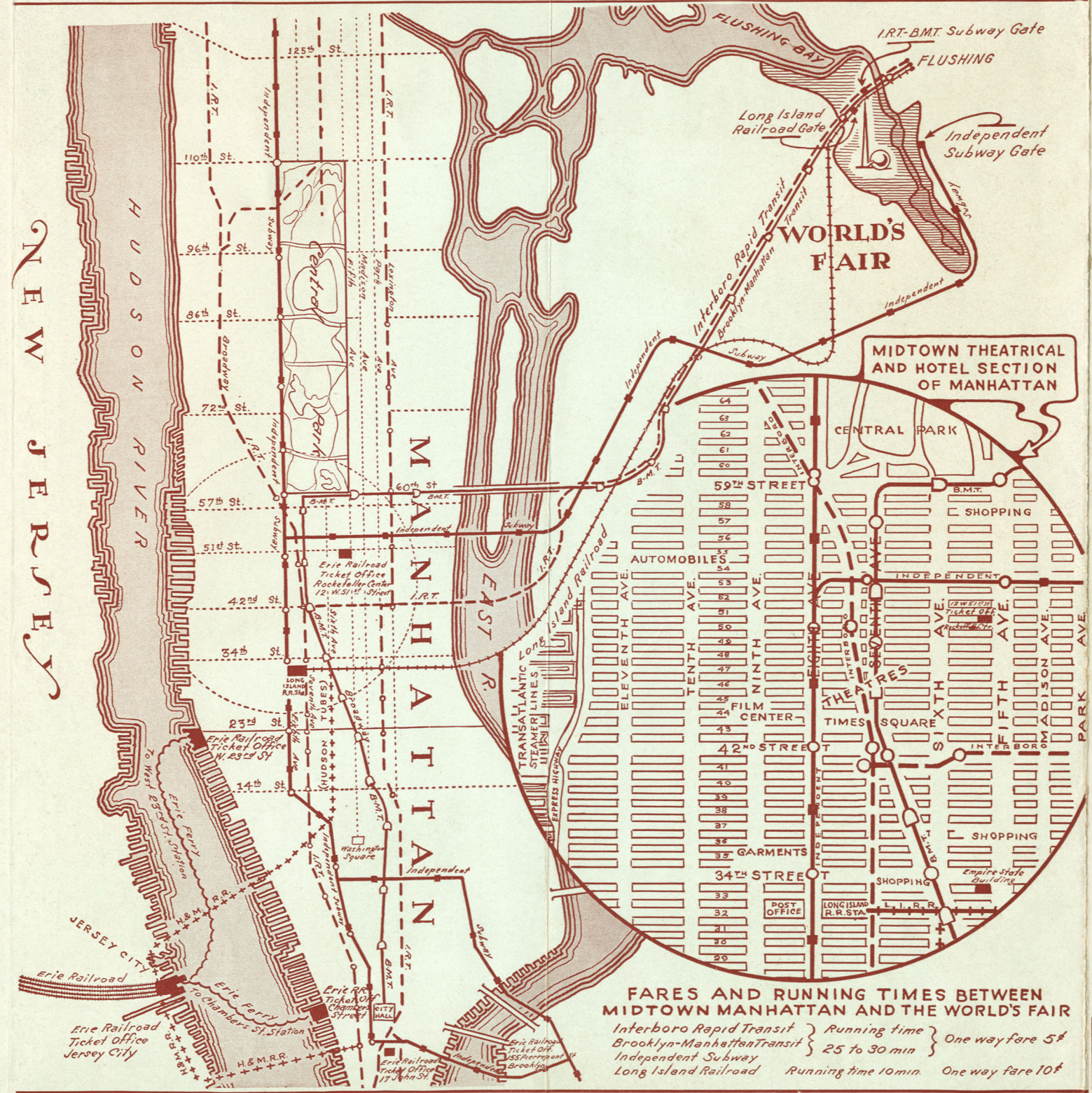

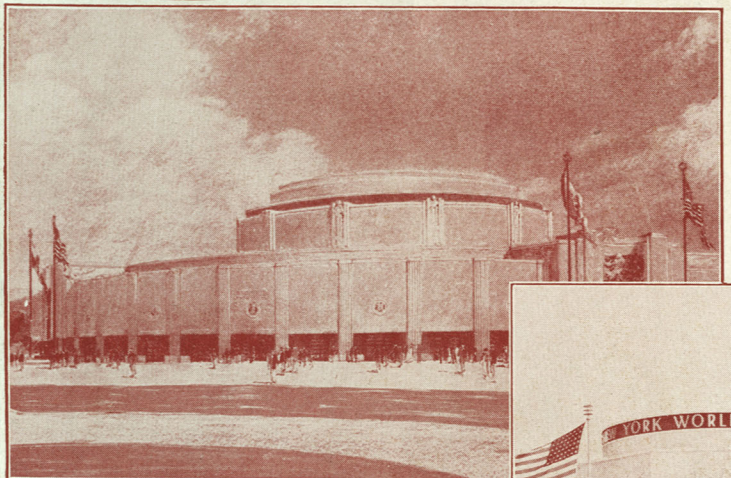

When you plan your trip East, plan on going via ERIE.



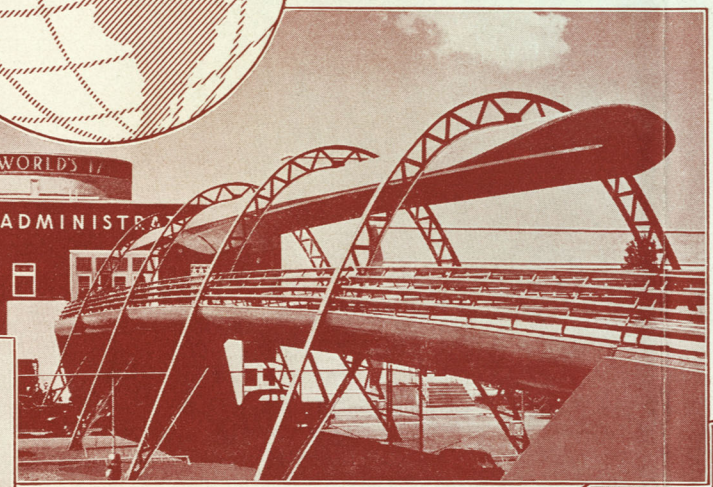

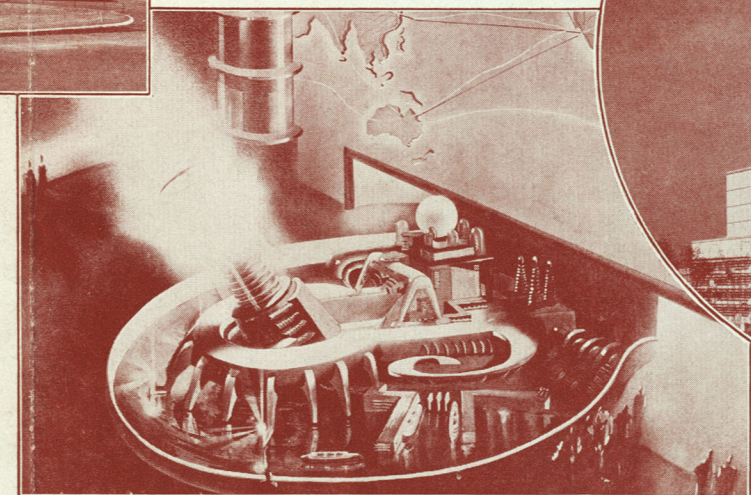
Left — The Administration Building in the central exhibit zone.



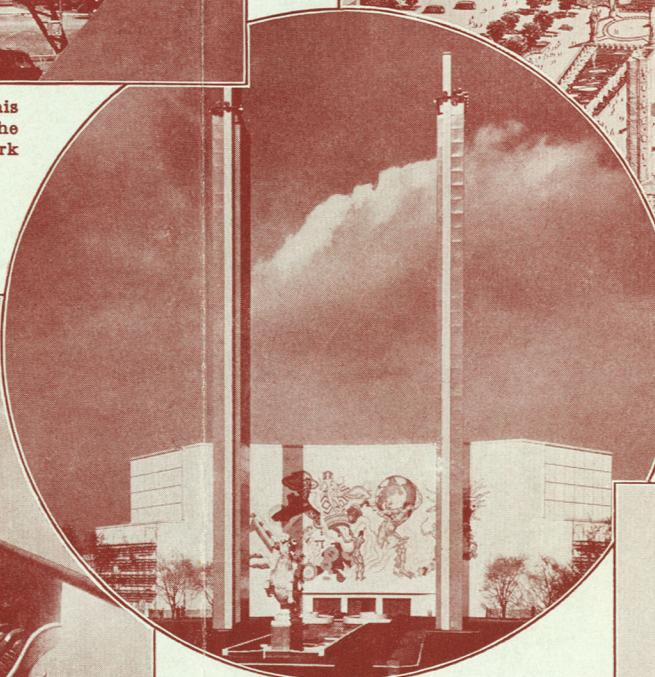
Above — Yacht-like in its lines is this Bridge of Tomorrow in service on the grounds of the \$150,000,000 New York World's Fair.



Below — The Aviation Building is another example of the unusual architectural shapes to be seen.

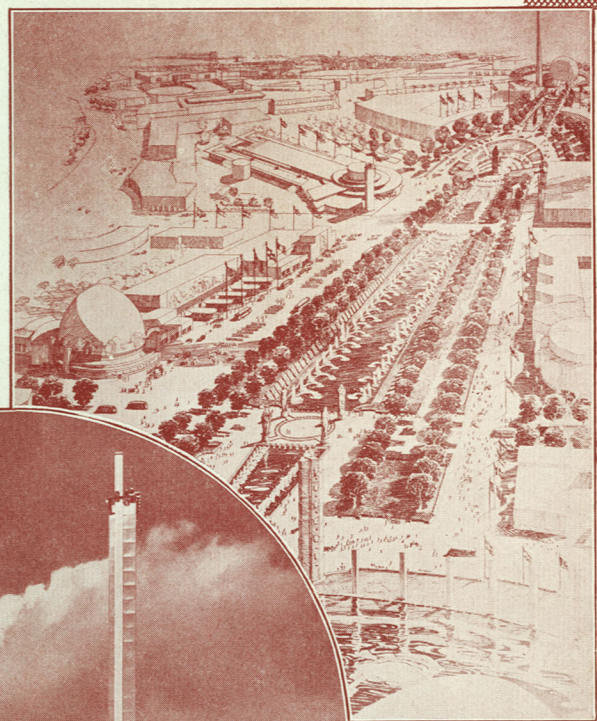


Above — A dramatic forecast of transportation methods of the World of Tomorrow with a scientific interpretation of the possibilities of travel through the stratosphere.
