The Pennsylvania Railroad Exhibit occupies a spacious area in Vacationland Building 1. Here one can follow, in vividly designed dioramas, scale models of a great railroad system at work. Motion pictures, too, present graphically various phases of the railroad's service, as well as scenic beauty spots which Pennsylvania Railroad trains traverse. Here, too, one may pause to relax amid the round of sight-seeing. In the center an inviting lounge provides luxurious modernistic couches and armchairs where you may rest.

RAILROADS AT WORK—A fascinating working model of a railroad (160 feet long, 40 feet deep) on which run 400 locomotives and cars over 3,800 feet of track... a detailed operation in miniature. This complete scale drama will be enacted in an enclosure seating 1,000 persons. Performances (about 35 minutes) every hour... 12 noon—9 P. M. Nominal admission charge.

RAILROADS BUILDING—An ingenious diorama and motion models give a detailed picture of railroads and equipment under construction.

RAILROADS ON PARADE—Magnificent pageant in 16 rapid-fire scenes on the development of transportation from stage coach and canal boat days to the present. 4 performances (about an hour) daily, except Monday: 2:15 P.M., 4:15 P. M., 7:15 P. M., 9:15 P. M. Nominal admission charge.

TRACK EXHIBITS — Actual trains and locomotives on 4,500 feet of track; the BIG ENGINE (illustrated); England's famous Coronation Scot; an Italian all-electric train... and other equipment of historical and modern design.
